Blessings! Yesterday, we honored the feast day of Saint Elizabeth Seton. As she faced life's trials and everyday challenges, Mother Seton became a cornerstone of the Catholic Church in America. Due to her vision, the Sisters of Charity was founded. Elizabeth Seton also started the first parish school and Catholic orphanage in America. We can follow her example by putting God's will before our own as we bear our cross.

Please join the school community as we come together at 9:15 am on Wednesday, January 10 for Mass. The seventh graders will serve as ministers at the celebration of the Eucharist.

I appreciate everyone's cooperation with Thursday's unexpected day off. Moving forward, we will continue to use "Quik Contact" (phone blast) to notify the community of unscheduled days off. I am currently monitoring the forecast for Monday morning's rush hour.

We are excitedly preparing for Catholic School's Week. Several surprises will be sprinkled in within the week, which will begin with the celebration of the liturgy on Sunday, January 28. A few of our wonderful eighth graders will read essays at Saturday's Vigil Mass at 5:00 pm and Sunday's Masses at 7:30, 9:00, and 11:00 am. Student-created posters will also be on display. The theme of the essays and posters will focus on learn, serve, lead and succeed. On Sunday, please take time to stop by the school from 11:30 – 1:00 to see the children's work and affirm our terrific faculty.

On Monday, January 29, the students may wear their Mary, Queen of Peace spirit wear. Mrs. Sue Oberkirsch will monitor the school Geography Bee in the afternoon. Parents, you are welcome to attend the bee at 1:00 pm.

The De Smet band will entertain the students in the afternoon on Tuesday, January 30. The children may wear their pajamas or out of school apparel on that day.

Parents, please join us for Mass on Wednesday, January 31 at 9:15 am as Mrs. Rachel Gilligan's fourth graders serve as ministers. After Mass, I will start a new annual tradition by naming a current teacher as Teacher of the Year. I will also name a former teacher to our Hall of Fame of Catholic educators. Those measures are meant to honor all of our educators, especially those who view their role as a true ministry. The festivities will continue with a teacher luncheon and the eighth grade taking over the school at the end of the day. That will

involve the students applying for any ministry or job in the school. In the end, they will dress for the part as a team teacher or serve as an administrator.

On Thursday, February 1, the students will create a rainbow of sorts. Each class will be assigned a color to wear. On this colorful day, the children may wear their assigned color as a shirt. The following are each grade's assigned colors: preschool and kindergarten – yellow, first grade – red or pink, second grade – white, third grade – green, fourth grade – orange, fifth grade – blue, sixth grade – purple, seventh grade – gray, and the eighth graders can choose any color. Students will need to wear their uniform bottoms. The day will end with the traditional eighth grade verses teacher volleyball game. In the spirit of service, we are asking for each student to bring in a can food to serve as admission to the game.

The family luncheon, another great Catholic School's Week tradition, will take place on Friday, February 2. The day will end with a new tradition, Linc's Big Game Show. The show will have a "Let's Make a Deal" flavor with several "minute to win" games. Students may wear crazy hats and socks to the show.

A professional opportunity for the teachers related to intruder training has presented itself. If acceptable, it would require the cancellation of the Spring Conferences.
